LIVELIHOOD OF TRIBALS DURING COVID LOCKDOWN

2215. SHRI D.M. KATHIR ANAND:

Will the Minister of TRIBAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is taking any measures to improve the livelihood of Tribals especially during COVID lockdown;
- (b) the details of Aboriginal Tribes in Tamil Nadu, the number of tribal people vaccinated in Tamil Nadu;
- (c) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR TRIBAL AFFAIRS (SMT. RENUKA SINGH SARUTA)

(a) Following measures have been taken to improve the livelihood of Tribals especially during COVID situations:

Ministry of Tribal Affairs provided funds to the State Governments based on their proposals for undertaking various livelihood activities including agriculture, horticulture, animal husbandry, fisheries and other non-farm based livelihood activities etc. under the schemes 'Special Central Assistance to Tribal Sub-Scheme (SCA to TSS)', 'Development of Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs)' and 'Grants under Article 275(1)' during 2020-21. An amount of Rs. 587.47 crore were approved / sanctioned to various State Governments for undertaking various livelihood activities as detailed at **Annexure 1**.

The Ministry of Tribal Affairs has been implementing the Scheme of 'Mechanism for Marketing of Minor Forest Produce (MFP) through Minimum Support Price (MSP) & Development of Value Chain for MFP' since 2013-14, with an objective of providing fair price to MFP gatherers, enhance their income level and ensure sustainable harvesting of MFPs. The Ministry of Tribal Affairs and TRIFED conducted a series of meetings through webinar with Chief Ministers, Hon'ble Member of Parliament of reserved constituencies, State Nodal Departments/State Implementing Agencies, advising the States about initiating procurement of MFPs and taking other livelihood measures.

The Ministry revised minimum support prices of MFP with a purpose of providing enhanced income to tribal gatherers. Further, additional 37 MFP items have also been included in the list of MSP for MFP Scheme to expand the ambit and coverage of the scheme vide notification dated 26.5.2020 and 11.11.2020. Thus, the Scheme currently covers a total 87 items.

On request of Ministry of Tribal Affairs, the Ministry of Home Affairs vide Order No. 40-3/2020-DM-I(A) dated 16/04/20 issued guidelines aiming to relax the provisions of lockdown for Collection, harvesting and processing of Minor Forest Produce(MFP)/ Non Timber Forest Produce (NTFP) by STs and other forest dwellers in forest areas across the country.

Under the scheme of Minimum Support Price (MSP) for Minor Forest Produce (MFP), TRIFED also implements the initiative of Van Dhan Vikas Kendras (VDVKs), launched in 2018-19, wherein tribal community owned Minor Forest Produce centric multi-purpose Kendras are set up in predominantly tribal districts which act as common facility centres for procurement cum value addition to locally available MFPs. Under Van Dhan Yojana, starting from 27 Aug 2019 onwards, TRIFED has so far sanctioned 2,275 Van Dhan Vikas Kendras consisting of 34,125 Vandhan Self Help groups in 24 States and 2 UTs, in which 6.77 lakh Tribal women forest gatherers have been on boarded. A total of Rs. 336.95 crore has been sanctioned by TRIFED for the purpose.

The ongoing intervention under PM Garib Kalyan Ann Yojana (PMJKAY) has been extended for a further period of five months till November, 2021, wherein, provision is there to provide an additional allocation of 5kg of food grains (wheat / rice), free of cost to around 80 crore National Food Security Act (NFSA) beneficiaries including tribal people.

Further, funds to the tune of Rs. 12355.43 crore have been provided as Scheduled Tribe Component (STC) by the other Central Ministries / Departments under livelihood related schemes during 2020-21 and 2021-22 as detailed at **Annexure 2**.

(b) & (c) The nomenclature of Aboriginal Tribes has not been adopted by Government of India in respect of any tribal group. However, there are six numbers of identified Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTG) in Tamil Nadu with total population over 2.5 lakh as per Census 2011.

The COVID-19 vaccination drive does not make any discrimination on the basis of gender, socio-economic class or residence etc. Record of religion or caste wise beneficiary details are not centrally maintained. State wise vaccination status is available in public domain at https://www.mohfw.gov.in. As on 28.07.2021, vaccination status in the State of Tamil Nadu is as under:
